We have really enjoyed exploring our topic 'Do Dragons Exist?' and have particularly enjoyed learning about and exploring castles in our classroom. We have read lots of different dragon stories and have even managed to make time to practice our numbers.

We have been very excited by the arrival of some special eggs in our classroom, and talked about what could be in them! We came in one day to find that the eggs had hatched and our classroom had been left in a big mess. Now we are busy working on writing a report to tell everyone what happened!

# **Bats and Foxes**

Bats and Foxes have had a lovely immersion into their new topic of 'Can you read me a story?' On the first day they were very excited to explore the classroom and examine the clues to find out the name of the traditional tale. The children looked wonderful in their costumes and enjoyed watching a pantomime in the afternoon whilst eating popcorn. Mrs Lang taught them to boo the baddies.

The children have enjoyed learning the stories of The Gingerbread Man, Goldilocks and the Three Bears and will be learning Little Red Riding Hood next week.

In Maths the children have learnt how to add one more and will be learning one less next week.

In Language the children made missing posters so the Gingerbread Man can be found, hopefully safe and well.

Reception have enjoyed their outdoor sessions. They have explored our nature area, used the loose parts to build bridges and followed the outdoor gingerbread man trail. They have loved making mud gingerbread men and planting magic beans. They can't wait to find out what they grow into.

The children are also enjoying their PE sessions on a Wednesday, and learning how to use the iPad in lots of different ways.

# Barn Owls and Moles

Year 2 are enjoying our new topic of 'Street Detectives' where we are learning about people in our community who help us e.g. police officers, doctors, vets. We had a fun Immersion Day where we dressed up and took on the roles of different community helpers.

The children have been learning how to identify and use rhyme and we are building up to writing rhyming poems. We have also been practising our number sequences, shapes, patterns and turns.

A big thank you for helping the children with their spellings each week, they are making great progress with these.

#### Red Squirrels and Dragonflies

Red Squirrels and Dragonflies have been very busy exploring their new topic 'Predators'. We have been looking at a range of predators from around the world, food chains and life cycles. In addition, we have designed a leaflet for Chester Zoo, and a new enclosure for aquatic predators.

For our outdoor learning we have been looking at frost and taking photos of ice on leaves, grass and twigs.

#### Kingfishers and Buzzards

It has been a great term and the children have worked extremely hard. The children have been busy completing activities linked to our topic 'Blue Abyss'.

The children have also done lots of outdoor learning including identifying areas around the school where we can collect rainwater and discussing ways in which we can use this. This involved us collecting data on the amount of rainfall and using it to create a graph.

The children also spent time in the forest school climbing trees and toasting marshmallows. We are looking forward to completing more fun activities over the coming weeks.

#### Otters and Dormice

As part of this topic we're going on a magical journey to find the gold hidden somewhere on Alchemy Island. We will read stories set in fantasy worlds that will inspire our story openings. We'll manipulate digital photographs, adding fantastical special effects.

Our Geography skills will improve as we look closely at maps of Alchemy Island, plotting routes and using coordinates. We'll explore the properties of materials and experiment with changes of state. If we're going to find gold, we'd better find out all about it!

In English we'll write soliloquies and poems inspired by the island's magical powers and dramatic landscape. The coding programme Scratch will help us to plot and correct errors in our route, and we'll use technology to create beautiful digital images. We'll use sound effects and mood music to reflect the atmosphere on Alchemy Island.

#### Eco Warriors

We have appointed our new Eco Warriors for the year and have created our new action plan. Thank you for your responses to the Eco Schools at home survey in the summer. We have used the results to inform our action plan.

This year, we will be trying to reduce our water use, energy use, reuse and recycle, plant more wild flowers, plant trees and stop litter at Penygarn.
